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Scope of Work

The Dosimetry Group of the Radiation Physics Division at NIST needs to purchase an Electric Pallet Truck to support the activities of the Group's technical program. Scope:

Task:

BASIS FOR AWARD: This is a competitive best value source selection utilizing Lowest Price Technically Acceptable (LPTA) source selection procedures in accordance with FAR 15.101-2 for award of this purchase order. The evaluation process shall proceed as follows:

1. By submission of an offer, the Offeror accepts all solicitation requirements,

including terms and conditions, representations and certification and technical requirements related to this order.

- 2. The Government intends to award a purchase order without discussions with respective Offerors. The Government, however, reserves the right to conduct discussions if deemed in its best interest.
