PROPOSITION 100
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to State Lands
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of permitting the exchange of state lands for other public lands if it is in the best interests of the state land trust, it conserves open space on trust lands offered in the exchange, or it assists in preserving military airports, and appraisals show the lands received and projected income and value will equal or exceed that of the state lands.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of not permitting exchange of state lands for other public lands.

PROPOSITION 101
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to initiative and referendum expenditures
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of providing that initiative or referendum measures that mandate an expenditure of state funds, establish a fund or allocate funding for any specific purpose, must also provide for increased revenues to cover the costs, which cannot come from the general fund, and permits the legislature to reduce the expenditures of state revenues to the amount of funding supplied by the identified revenue source.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of not requiring initiatives and referendums to include a dedicated funding source for required expenditures.

PROPOSITION 102
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to state ownership of securities
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of allowing the state to license or transfer interests in technology or intellectual property created or acquired by state funded universities or the Arizona Board of Regents in exchange for ownership interests and securities in a company or corporation.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the current prohibition on the state becoming an owner or shareholder in any company or corporation except in the case of ownerships that occur by law and from investments of state funds.

PROPOSITION 103
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to Justices of the Peace
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of permitting individuals appointed to serve as temporary justices of the peace to have the same qualifications as elected justices of the peace and to allow temporary justices of the peace to reside outside the precinct that they are appointed to serve.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the requirement that temporary justices of the peace be attorneys.

PROPOSITION 104
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to initiative petitions
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of allowing an initiative petition to be circulated for signatures up to 27 months before the general election and requires the petitions to be filed with the secretary of state at least 7 months prior to the election at which it will be voted on.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the current initiative circulation period of 24 months before the general election and filing deadline of 4 months before the general election.

PROPOSITION 105
Proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution by the legislature relating to the state board of education
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of changing the composition of the state board of education by replacing a member of the state junior college board with a president or chancellor of a community college district and increasing the board from 8 to 10 members by adding a charter school owner or administrator and a fourth public member.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the current composition of the state education board.

PROPOSITION 200
Proposed by initiative petition relating to voting and public benefits
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of [1] requiring a person to submit evidence of United States citizenship when registering to vote, [2] requiring the county recorder to reject any voter registration that is not accompanied by proof of citizenship, [3] requiring voters to present a photo identification with name and address or two other forms of identification with name and address before receiving a ballot at the polling place, [4] requiring state and local governments to verify the identity and eligibility of applicants for state and local public benefits that are not federally mandated, [5] requiring government employees to report violations of United States immigration law by applicants for public benefits, [6] making it a class 2 misdemeanor if a government employee fails to make the required report and [7] permitting private lawsuits by any resident to enforce provisions relating to public benefits.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the current laws regarding citizenship when registering to vote and not requiring voters to show identification documents at the polls prior to voting, and keeping the current requirements when applying for public benefits.

PROPOSITION 300
Recommendation of the commission on salaries for elective state officers relating to legislators' salaries
 A "yes" vote shall have the effect of raising State Legislators' salaries to \$36,000 per year.
 A "no" vote shall have the effect of keeping State Legislators' salaries at \$24,000 per year.

RELATING TO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION EXCISE (SALES) TAXES
 Do you favor the continuation of a county transaction privilege (sales) tax for regional transportation purposes in Maricopa County?
 A "YES" vote has the effect of continuing the transaction privilege (sales) tax in Maricopa County for twenty years to provide funding for transportation projects as contained in the regional transportation plan.
 A "NO" vote has the effect of rejecting the transaction privilege (sales) tax for transportation purposes in Maricopa County.

 Shall the Maricopa Community Colleges be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds in the amount of \$951,359,000 for capital outlay to provide education and job training to meet the needs of students?
