Education (see ILAC-G11, 4.2)	At least post-secondary qualification in a scientific/technological discipline. (Experience in the field of expertise may be substituted as judged on a case-by-case basis.)							
Work experience (see ILAC-G11, 4.2)	At least 4 years of experience in laboratory testing or calibration, two of which should be in the assigned field of assessment.							
Training (see ILAC-G11, 4.2)	Successful completion of a training course or a combination of training courses which cover the topics listed in the NVLAP Assessor Training Syllabus (see also ILAC-G11:07/2006).							
Assessment experience (see ILAC-G11, 4.2)	Attendance at and/or participation in one or more laboratory assessments, using ISO/IEC 17025.							
Language proficiency (see ILAC-G11, 4.2)	Proficient in spoken and written English.							
Communication/ interpersonal skills	Demonstrated ability to communicate orally and in writing.
