MEMORANDUM AND ORDER June 11, 1999 "Indeed Denbeaux draws an interesting analogy to eyewitness identification. Courts have concluded, as a matter of law, that one-on-one show-ups are unduly suggestive. Likewise, Denbeaux suggests, are one-onone handwriting comparisons. The outcome of this analysis, for example, may be different if Harrison were given a "lineup" of similar handwriting exemplars to review, and asked to determine which of this group is most similar to the robbery note author. Whether one adopts that specific approach or not, one thing is clear: when Harrison says, 'I conclude that Hines wrote the robbery note,' she may well be going beyond her expertise."

















# Known Writer Requirements

- Needed more than 1,000 completed London Letters.
- Writers of Knowns ranged from 15 to 75+.
- Utilized churches, businesses, colleges.
- Writing samples not following guidelines were culled from the core sample to arrive at the final 1,000.

# Questioned Documents

- Two London Letters distributed to a new set of unknown writers.
- Told to write London Letter twice in a natural style.
- One letter assigned a (Q) letter.
- Second letter assigned (K) number, duplicating a number already in the 1,000 Known.
- 56 Knowns with corresponding Questioned documents replaced 56 pages in the 1,000 suspect exemplars.


