FISSEA invites proposals for Panel Discussions, Topic Sessions, and the Pecha Kucha (Lightning Round). Panel Discussions are 50 minutes in length. Topic Sessions are 25 minutes. Pecha Kucha means "chit chat" in Japanese. We use the term to describe a session that contains a series of rapid-paced slides (20 slides are shown for 20 seconds each for a total of 6 minutes, 40 seconds.)

Please keep in mind that sessions are not marketing opportunities, thus corporate marketing materials are not permitted during the sessions. The Federal Business Council (FBC) will host a Vendor and Federal Agency Exhibition on March 25th. FBC contact information is provided on the website.
