U.S. Standardization System



- Emphasizes private-sector standards solutions
- Standards users drive activities
- Provides a strong voice and greater authority to standards users and individual stakeholders

- In the U.S. alone, there are more than 100,000 standards
- These documents are being developed by:
 - hundreds of standards developing organizations (SDOs)
 - over 500 consortia
 - hundreds of thousands of technical committees
- Over 11,000 approved American National Standards



The Public-Private Partnership











- System is led by private sector
 - No single government agency has control over standards
 - Each agency determines which standards meet its needs
- National Technology Transfer and Advancement Act (NTTAA)
- Thousands of government employees sit on standards developing committees
 - 100 from NIST in ISO alone
