The Davis-Bacon Program Manager leads the CHIPS Program Office's efforts to implement and oversee Davis-Bacon and Related Acts (DBRA) compliance for construction projects funded under the CHIPS and Science Act. The incumbent develops and manages policies, processes, and performance measurement approaches that ensure compliance with prevailing wage requirements while evaluating the workforce impacts of CHIPS-funded construction investments, including workforce development, training, wages, and demographic representation. Serving as the principal advisor on DBRA matters, the Program Manager provides guidance to Department of Commerce officials, funding recipients, contractors, subcontractors, and Federal partners, and leads initiatives that support effective program implementation, compliance oversight, and workforce outcomes across the CHIPS portfolio.

Individuals with extensive experience administering DBRA compliance programs; overseeing labor standards compliance for federally funded construction projects; developing workforce performance measurement, reporting, and data analysis programs; and advising government, industry, labor, and recipient stakeholders on prevailing wage and workforce requirements are encouraged to apply by emailing a resume to [jaclyn.vincent@chips.gov](mailto:jaclyn.vincent@chips.gov).

The Davis-Bacon Program Manager position is at the ZA-0340-IV level (salary range: \$149,913 to \$187,093 annually). U.S. citizenship is required. This position requires the ability to obtain and maintain a High Risk Public Trust background investigation (Tier 4). The position is in Washington, DC at the DOC HQ.
