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

SHARE OF SAN DIEGO CYBER FIRMS ENGAGED WITH AI




ENGAGED WITH AI FOR <u>AT LEAST</u> 3 YEARS



PRODUCTIVITY WAS TRIPLE THE REGIONAL AVERAGE (2018-2021)




% OF CYBER FIRMS HIRING IN THE NEXT 12 MONTHS

believe digital citizenship is at least moderately effective in helping students make smart, safe and ethical decisions online.






Defining Media Literacy and Digital Citizenship

- Definitions vary.
- Media literacy addresses the ability to analyze, evaluate, access and create media.
- Digital citizenship places more emphasis on online safety and responsibility.

Media Literacy and Digital Citizenship Legislation







HB19-1110 (2019): created a media literacy advisory committee responsible for creating a report regarding recommendations for implementing media literacy education.

State Example: Colorado

HB21-1103 (2021): requires the department of education to implement recommendations from the media literacy advisory committee.


