Anyhow, the voting technology available to those with Disabilities was subpar. As far as I was aware, the polling location only had paper ballots for those who are Disabled. I am not sure if Disabled voters are allowed to exit their vehicles to go inside. This is a problem because those with visual impairments would have a difficult time completing those paper ballots.

Besides this, the poll workers who assisted me seemed clueless. Their training on how to interact with Disabled voters and promote voting efficiency was not great. I waited for twenty minutes before someone gave me a paper ballot. It took another ten to fifteen minutes for them to collect my ballot. I ended up spending about an hour at my polling location. Thankfully, I did not have any additional responsibilities that day. Others were probably not as fortunate as me.
