

Robyn Ragsdale, Ph.D. is a senior crime laboratory analyst in the Biology Section at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) in the Tampa Bay Regional Operations Center and has been with FDLE since 1995. Along with casework duties, she has also served as statewide DNA technical leader (2001-2007) as well as a crime laboratory analyst supervisor (2007-2011). She was a member of SWGDAM (2002-2007) on the Quality Assurance Subcommittee and served as both a Legacy and International Assessor for ASCLD/LAB and now conducts assessments for ANSI-ASQ National

Accreditation Board. Dr. Ragsdale is also a member of the National DNA Indexing System Review Panel as well as a member of the Biology Consensus Body of the American Standards Board of AAFS. Dr. Ragsdale has testified numerous times in both state and federal court and has presented presentations at scientific and legal conferences. She has also provided numerous educational presentations and workshops for current forensic scientists and forensic science students. Dr. Ragsdale has been the recipient of several awards and was recognized by the State of Florida as Forensic Scientist of the Year in 2002.

Robyn Ragsdale received her Ph.D. in Medical Sciences in 1990 from the University of South Florida College of Medicine (USFCOM) and conducted postdoctoral research in the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology also at USFCOM.

She was appointed to the <u>FSSB</u> in 2018 and serves as the Chair of the <u>Biology SAC</u>.
