

Stephen Greene is an International Association for Identification (IAI) certified latent print examiner/crime scene investigator and is currently the 4th Vice President of the IAI. He is a Manager Program/Project with IDEMIA with an extensive background in latent print examination, crime scene investigation, and footwear/tire examination. He is also current the Executive Secretary and past Chair of the Footwear and Tire Impression Consensus Body of the AAFS Standards Board.

Mr. Greene has held positions as a senior scientist at US Customs and Border Protection (CBP), and as a latent print examiner at the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL) and the US Army National Ground Intelligence Center (NGIC). During Operation Iraqi Freedom, he contributed to the development and deployment of the first Multi National Corps-Iraq (MNC-I) Provost Marshall's Office Law Enforcement Forensics Laboratory. Additionally, he played a role in the management of the Biometrics Laboratory in Bagram, Afghanistan.

Aside from being affiliated with the IAI, Mr. Greene is also a member of the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences. He previously served as the secretary for the IAI Footwear Certification Board and the Student Advocacy Committee. Mr. Greene holds a B.S. in Forensic Science from California State University, Sacramento, and an M.S. in Legal Studies with a concentration in Homeland Security from California University of Pennsylvania.

Mr. Greene has received several awards related to his work in forensics, to include: US CBP Commissioner's Integrity Award, US CBP Commissioner's Law Enforcement Officer Award, Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Award, US Army Superior Civilian Service Award, and MNC-I Commanding General's Award for Combat Excellence.

He was appointed to the FSSB in 2020 and currently serves as the IAI representative.
