

Dr. Jeri Ropero-Miller, F-ABFT, is the Senior Director within the Center of Forensic Sciences of the Applied Justice Research Division, RTI International. With expertise and board certification by the American Board of Forensic Toxicology, she has published nationally and internationally on topics of postmortem drug studies, emerging drug threats, hair drug studies, drug surveillance and intelligence, and technology evaluation and adoption. She is the Program Director for the National Institute of Justice's Forensic Technology Center of Excellence and its Criminal Justice Technology Evaluation Consortium;

the current Project Associate Director for the Drug Enforcement Administration-funded National Forensic Laboratory Information System project and the Co-Director for the Bureau of Justice Statistics-funded 2018 Census of Medical Examiners/Coroners' Offices and 2019 Census of Publicly Funded Forensic Crime Laboratories. She received her doctorate in Clinical Chemistry and Forensic Toxicology from the University of Florida College of Medicine. She has served in multiple positions with the National Institute of Standards and Technology's Organization of Scientific Area Committees for Forensic Sciences including the Executive Secretary of the Chemistry SAC, Toxicology Subcommittee member, and currently the Forensic Sciences Standards Board. She is the 2021-2022 Past President of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences.

She was appointed to the **FSSB** in 2021 where she serves as the AAFS representative.
