

Hal R. Arkes is an emeritus professor of Psychology at Ohio State University. He obtained his B.A. from Carleton College in 1967 and his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan in 1971. He is a former program officer at the National Science Foundation and a former president of the Society for Judgment and Decision Making. He has over 130 publications mainly in the domains of medical, legal, and economic decision making. He has also served thousands of meals as a cook in the United States Army.
