

Gerry LaPorte, B. Sc. B. Commerce, M.S.F.S., has been employed in various capacities in the forensic sciences since 1993 and currently serves as the Laboratory Director of the Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) – Forensic Laboratory. Prior to HSI, Mr. LaPorte has served as the Director of Research Innovation at Florida International University’s Global Forensic and Justice Center, Director of the Office of Investigative and Forensic Sciences at the National Institute of Justice, and Chief Forensic Chemist at the United States Secret Service. He was the co-chair of the Standards Practices and Protocols Interagency Working Group, under the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) within the Executive Office of the President of the United States. Mr. LaPorte was selected by the Attorney General of the United States to work on the National Commission on Forensic Science (NCFS). He has been actively involved in the writing and implementation of standards since 2002 and held positions as the Chairperson of the Forensic Document Examination Subcommittee and Vice Chair of the Physics Scientific Area Committee on the Organization of Scientific Area Committees (OSAC) for Forensic Science, which works to strengthen the nation’s use of forensic science by facilitating the development of technically sound forensic science standards. He has authored numerous publications, including chapters in four forensic science textbooks, and has given sworn testimony as an expert witness in International and U.S. Courts over 140 times.
