# Themes that Emerged from 2010 HITPC/ Meaningful Use Workgroup Hearings

- Achieve 4 Es: **engage**, educate, empower, and **enable**
  - Meet **needs** of diverse population
  - Accessibility/**usability** of data
    - Need for mobile apps (esp. for vulnerable populations)
    - Contextualizing information
    - Multiple languages
    - Compatible with assistive technologies
  - Patient-provider secure **messaging**
  - Incorporate **patient-generated** data into EHR
  - Provide ample **training** on all functionalities
