

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION

During the Enter-on-Duty orientation process, you **MUST** present **TWO** acceptable forms of identification. One ID must be any of the items from the list of **PRIMARY FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION**. The other ID must be from the list of **SECONDARY FORM OF IDENTIFICATION**.

PRIMARY FORM OF IDENTIFICATION	SECONDARY FORM OF IDENTIFICATION
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ U.S Passport (unexpired or expired) ▪ Driver's license or ID card issued by a state or possession of the United States provided it contains a photograph (unexpired) ▪ U.S. Military ID card (unexpired) ▪ U.S. Military dependant's ID card (unexpired) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ U.S. Social Security Card issued by the Social Security Administration ▪ Original or certified copy of a birth certificate issued by a state, county, municipal authority, or outlying possession of the United States bearing an official seal ▪ U.S. citizen ID card (Form 1-197) ▪ ID Card for use of Resident Citizen in the United States (Form 1-179) ▪ Certification of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State (Form FS-545 or Form DS-1350) ▪ Unexpired employment authorization document issued by DHS ▪ Native American tribal document

For example, the following are all acceptable combinations of ID that will successfully validate your identity:

Example 1:

- a) U.S. Passport
- b) U.S. Social Security Card

Example 2:

- a) U.S. Military Card
- b) Unexpired employment authorization document issued by DHS

Example 3:

- a) U.S. Driver's license
- b) Original or certified copy of a birth certificate
