I get - and expect you do too - many emails purporting to be from banks, merchants etc trying to get you to log in to 'your account' so that they can steal your details.

I always try and forward these to the organization they pretend to be from by sending them to [fraud@\\*\\*\\*\\*\\*.com](mailto:fraud@*****.com) - sometimes they get there - often they don't.

My idea is to have a central/common email address where these can be sent like [fraud@fraud.com](mailto:fraud@fraud.com) - from where they can be forwarded to the relevant organisation AND also be examined/counted/correlated etc.

I feel this could be a very useful tool centrally but also be a way to ensure that more scam emails are both detected and assessed.

It would also be very easy and relatively inexpensive to advertise [fraud@fraud.com](mailto:fraud@fraud.com) as the place to send ANY suspicious email.

Hope you can make use of this idea
