

David Fowler, M.D. is a board-certified anatomic and forensic pathologist practicing as Chief Medical Examiner for the State of Maryland. He graduated from the University of Cape Town in 1983 and did a year of general medical and surgical internship, followed by a year of pediatric pathology at the Red Cross Children's Hospital in Cape Town. He then started and completed a five-year full-time training program in forensic pathology at the University of Cape Town earning his Master of Medicine in forensic pathology. Following this, he did additional training in the United States at the

University of Maryland and the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the state of Maryland.

Dr. Fowler is an Associate Professor at the University of Maryland in the departments of pediatrics and pathology, faculty at the National Study Center for Trauma and EMS and is a visiting professor at both Tongji Medical School and Fudan University in the People's Republic of China. Dr. Fowler is active on multiple committees in the National Association of Medical Examiners and is a past president of that organization. He has numerous book chapters, scientific journal articles, and formal presentations to his credit.
