



Stephen Greene is an International Association for Identification (IAI) certified latent print examiner/crime scene investigator and is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the IAI. He is a Senior Scientist with US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) with an extensive background in latent print examination, crime scene investigation, and footwear/tire examination. He is also current the Chair of the Footwear and Tire Impression Consensus Body of the AAFS Standards Board.

Mr. Greene has worked for the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL) and for the US Army National Ground Intelligence Center (NGIC) as a latent print examiner, assisted with the development/deployment of the first Multi National Corps-Iraq Provost Marshall's Office Law Enforcement Forensics Laboratory during Operation Iraqi Freedom, and assisted in managing the Biometrics Laboratory in Bagram, Afghanistan.

In addition to his affiliation through the IAI, Mr. Greene is a Member of the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences. He is the past secretary of the IAI Footwear Certification Board and current Chair of the Student Advocacy Committee. Mr. Greene has a B.S. in Forensic Science from California State University, Sacramento and a M.S. in Legal Studies (conc. Homeland Security) from California University of Pennsylvania.

Mr. Greene has received several awards related to his work in forensics, to include: US CBP Commissioner's Integrity Award, US CBP Commissioner's Law Enforcement Officer Award Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Award, US Army Superior Civilian Service Award, and Commanding General's Award for Combat Excellence, MNC-I.
