### Naches Park and Recreation District

**PROPOSITION NO. 1**  
**GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$800,000**  
The Board of Commissioners of Naches Park and Recreation District has adopted Resolution No. 8200 concerning this proposition to issue Naches Park and Recreation District improvement bonds. This proposition authorizes Naches Park and Recreation District to expand and improve the outdoor swimming pool, including adding lanes and a shallow area, replacing the plumbing, and upgrading existing amenities, to issue [\$800,000] of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years to finance such improvements, and to levy property taxes annually in excess of regular property tax levies to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 8200.
